Lately, we've been making headway with this marriage stuff and this is just one setback that will be righted later on. Just wait and see. I've always had a good sense of right and wrong and I've looked at love from all sides now and I see nothing wrong with same sex marriage. But who said fighting for your rights was going to be easy? So, now you will have to live with one of my personal stories where I reflect on myself in some heroic light. If only it weren't true.

I recently read a book, <u>**The Gay Husband</u>** <u>**Checklist for Women Who Wonder** [Kindle Edition] By: Bonnie Kaye, that said 25 % of gays</u></u> can have sex with both men and women and that 65 % of that 25% go ahead and get married, then carry on a secret gay life, while struggling to maintain a straight existence. Hard to follow, is it? Or hard to imagine?

Well, I don't know how accurate the percentages are, but the whole premise is true. Could this reflect your family? Just think, if there were no stigma lurking around homosexuality no one would ever have to worry about this. So where is all this leading?

I fought this urge as hard as I could, since I was a child, because I wanted the wife, the house, maybe the children, the white picket fence, and that whole American dream. But something never seemed right to me. It never seemed like it was supposed to happen to me.

I remember going to my first gay bar (over 30 years ago) while my girlfriend was staying with her parents in a different state. She was in Pennsylvania and I was in Florida with my parents. It was right after college. We'd been dating for 5 years. Well, I had had my excursions with men in college, unbeknownst to anyone, but had avoided gay bars. I thought it would be all swishy men. Imagine my surprise to find out that there were all types of men in a gay bars. It was a candy store. I knew I could never go back to the straight world...I had found home. But yet, I was still scared. There was still so much stigma surrounding being gay. And nobody at that time seemed to have the same values as I did. I was laughed at by other gays when I mentioned long term relationships, happy homes, and whatnot. Still, I knew, this was where I was meant to be and that I would find what I wanted when I needed it.

One night I had a very vivid dream that I had gotten married and had 3 daughters. My wife, 3 daughters, and I lived in Colorado where I was some type of successful businessman. But I had a dark secret. My gay urges had grown stronger through the years and I was arrested one night while trolling for sex in public spaces. The look of horror on my family's faces woke me up. I sat up in bed in a cold sweat knowing what I needed to do. There just was no way around it. The dream was just too real.

I said there was really nothing we could do about it. Of course she was upset with me and we didn't talk for a year, but after that cooling off period, we became best of friends.

She eventually fell in love with someone else and had a baby girl and all was well in the world.

As for me, not long after I spoke to her, I found the man of my dreams and we've been living together for 28 years through thick and thin and better for worse times. Yes. I was able to finally latch on to someone and never let go. Good for me. And I hope it's been good for my man.

So what's the point of all this? I'm not quite sure, except to say to those who think they might be gay who are thinking about getting married, please hold off! Don't make that plunge just yet. Look into the future as honestly as possible and envision what it might be like. Yes, coming out is hard, but there are people all along the way to help you make that transition with pride, not self degradation. Favorite Recipe

Chicken Marsala Ingredients

1/2 cup all-purpose flour
1 tablespoon Essence, recipe follows
2 (6 to 8-ounce) boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cut in halves and pounded thin
1 tablespoon olive oil
4 tablespoons butter

3 cups sliced mushrooms (cremini, oyster, shiitake) 3/4 cup Marsala

1 cup chicken stock

Salt and freshly ground black pepper Chopped chives, for garnish

Directions

In a shallow bowl or plate combine the flour and Essence and stir to combine thoroughly. Quickly dredge the chicken breast halves in the seasoned flour mixture, shaking to remove any excess flour. Heat the oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat until very hot but not smoking. Add 1 tablespoon of the butter and cook the chicken breasts until golden brown on both sides, about 3 minutes per side. Transfer to a plate and set aside. Add 1 tablespoon of the remaining butter to the pan and add the mushrooms. Cook, stirring frequently, until mushrooms are golden brown around the edges and have given off their liquid. Add the Marsala wine and bring to a boil, scraping to remove any browned bits from the bottom of the pan. When the wine has reduced by half, add the chicken stock and cook for 3 minutes, or until the sauce has thickened slightly. Lower the heat to medium and return the chicken breasts to the pan and continue to cook until they are cooked through and the sauce has thickened, about 5 to 6 minutes. Swirl in the remaining 2 tablespoons of butter, add salt and pepper, to taste. Garnish with chopped chives and serve immediately.

The Music City Couples Network, an organization of hundreds of loving and committed gay and lesbian couples believes that the Federal Marriage Amendment is an unconscionable assault on the rights of millions of American citizens, and is joining other organizations seeking its defeat. According to the Human Rights Campaign (HRC), the amendment "would not only deny marriage to same-sex couples but could also denv any state legislature or electorate from ever voting to pass their own state's domestic partnership, civil union or marriage laws. Under the Federal Marriage Amendment, courts could be barred from enforcing the legal protections

that a legislature provides through civil union or domestic partnership laws."

Civil marriage, other forms of relationship recognition, and basic civil rights protections are essential components that make all families, including families headed by samesex couples, safer and more secure. Civil marriage and religious marriage are two separate things.

Religious institutions will never be forced to bless relationships with which they disagree, just as today religious institutions can refuse to marry couples of different faiths or individuals who have been divorced.
